

# 1. You need to download Java from <https://java.com/en/download/>

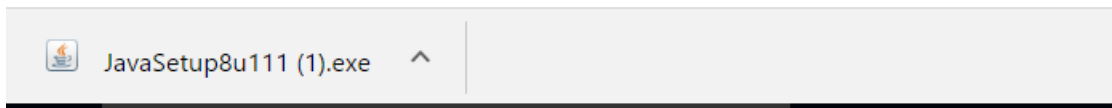
# 2. To download first click on the "Free Java Download" button

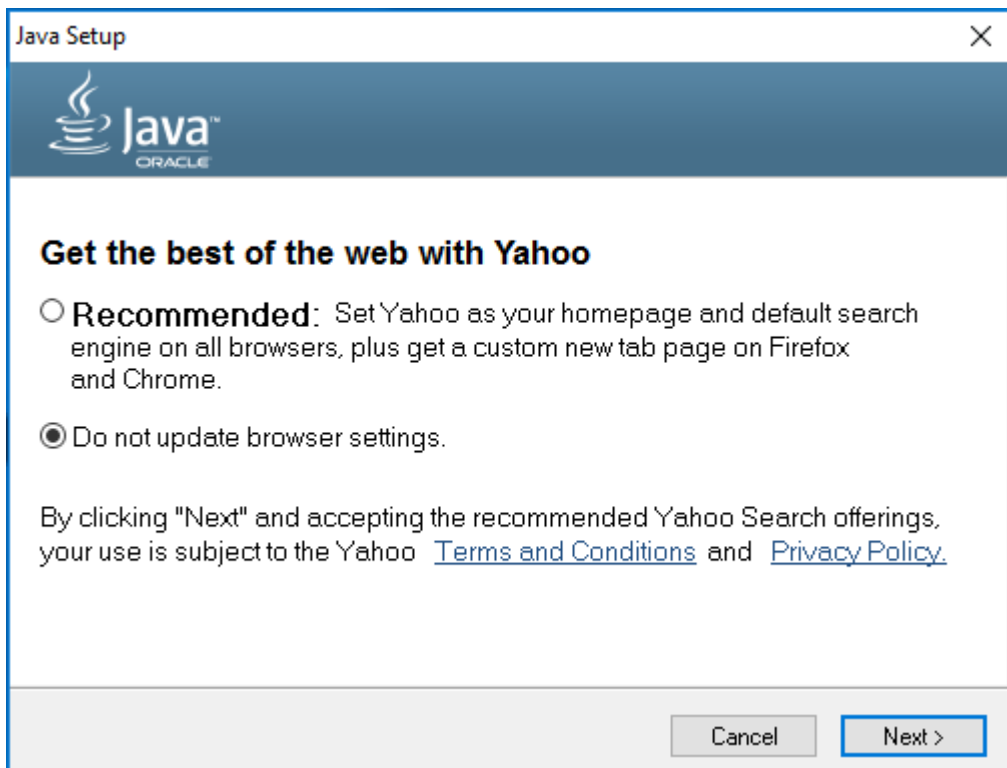


4. Once downloaded, click to open

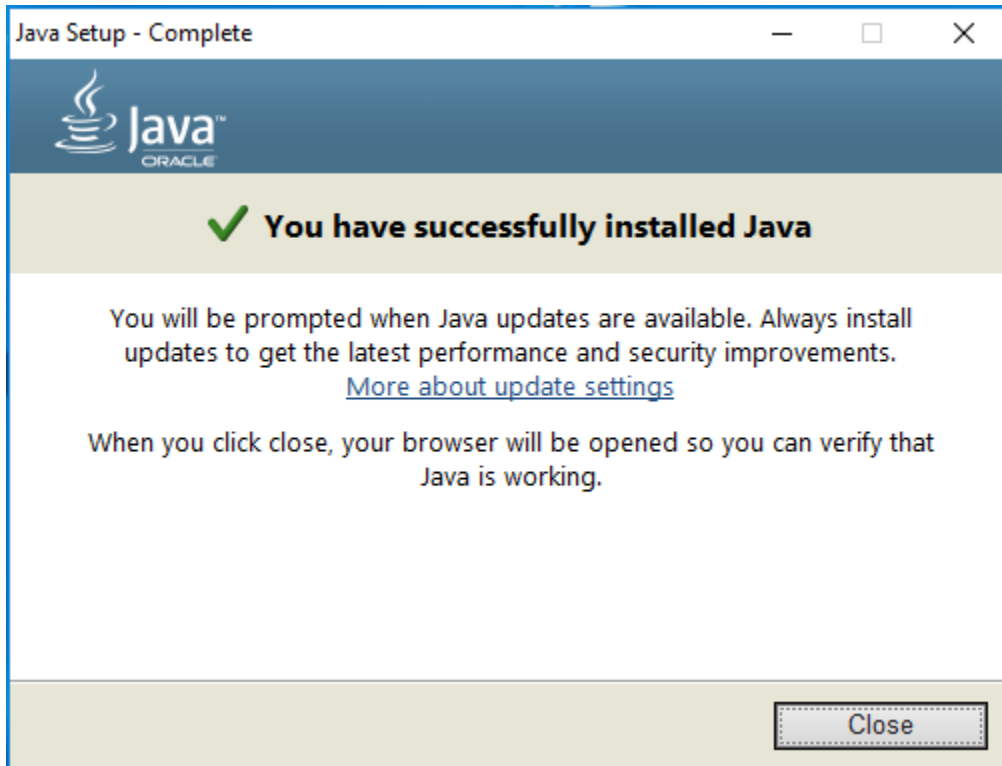




5. At this point the install matches the update. If you are installing Java click "Install." If you got an update for Java click "update"



6. Sometimes the install will ask to install another program or change internet settings. Make sure to select "do not change settings" or "no" to the optional programs or change. Click "next" to install



7. After it installs you can click "close." Java is now installed!
